Purpose Driven Curriculum and Pathways Program

An essential portion of our purpose driven curriculum will be the Pathway Program. The goal of our Pathway Program is to ensure that our experience and course work has a purpose and that our curriculum prepares students to attend a four-year college, attend a two-year technical college, transition into the workplace, or acquire functional life skills. We want our students, in conjunction with their parents, to begin formulating an idea of what they want to do after high school. This program is an integral part of our purpose driven curriculum which identifies different academic pathways for our students. These informed decisions will assist students to register in the appropriate coursework and ultimately enable them to be successful in their post—secondary endeavors. The first step to success is to pick a Pathway below.

HONDRS ACADEMY

This program will involve a small number of students. selected from all three high schools, who will demonstrate exceptional academic ability and talent. Students will enroll in dual credit classes, participate in Governor's School, Lab School or WCC Scholars Program, and will focus on STEM initiatives. Students will be challenged with a rigorous curriculum. This pathway is designed for our most advanced students.

COLLEGE SCHOLARS

This program will involve students who have completed most of their high school requirements and who want to focus on gaining college credits. Students will be required to take a specific set of dual- enrollment classes that will prepare them to enter a four-year college.

COLLEGE READINESS

This program will involve students who plan on attending college, but who are not ready or interested in a full load of dual enrollment credits during high school. We will ensure students have all of the necessary coursework to successfully enter most two or four-year colleges. Advanced courses are strongly encouraged by the Senior year of high school.



CAREER READINESS

This program is designed for students who are focused on earning a certification or license for a specific vocation. Students in this pathway will be ready for work immediately after graduation. Students will enroll in classes at WCTC and WCC as appropriate. Consequently, students may opt to register in dual-enrollment vocational courses. Students are strongly encouraged to enroll in our JVG program. Release time to work may be granted while earning high school credits.

LIFE SKILLS/ GRADUATION



This program will address students who are struggling with the traditional high school curriculum. These students will focus on functional academics which will help them gain independence, basic job skills, and daily living skills.

TRANSITION TO WORK

 This program is designed for students who possess a clear

Within each cluster, WCPS offers numerous elective courses that correspond to a collection of educational opportunities to prepare you for your chosen career.


WHAT CLASSES SHOULD I TAKE TO MAKE THE MOST OUT OF MY TIME IN HIGH SCHOOL?

STEP 1

Log in and take the Student Interest Inventory on MajorClarity.com to help determine what career choices are available based on what activities you enjoy, your personal qualities, and the subject you like.

STEP2

Explore the career clusters that best match your interests and talents. High School students should narrow their choices down to 2-3 career clusters they would like to explore while in High School.



✓	Career Cluster	<u>Description</u>
	Agriculture, Food and Natural Resources	The agriculture, food and natural resources cluster includes everything related to the creation of agricultural products. This includes farmers, ranchers, scientists, engineers and veterinarians.
	Architecture and Construction	The Architecture and Construction cluster includes people who are involved in designing, building and maintaining homes, industrial facilities, streets or bridges. The roles vary from carpenter helper to safety engineers, so educational requirements vary.
	Arts, Audio/Visual Technology and Communications	The Arts, A/V Technology and Communications cluster may be the best career cluster for creative people. It includes journalists, actors, dancers, singers, radio announcers and behind-the-scenes workers.
		The Business, Management and Administration cluster includes business analysts, accountants, HR professionals and managers, and many entry-level positions, like receptionists, secretaries and typists.
	Education and Training	The Education and Training career cluster includes teacher, tutor and instructor roles. This area also employs counselors, school psychologists and speech-language pathologists who offer support and guidance to students.
	Energy	Careers in the energy industry relate to extracting or harnessing power from a variety of sources, refining it and distributing it, and ensuring its safe use by consumers. With vast supplies of natural resources and ever-improving technologies, the United States is a global leader in the production of energy.
	Finance	The roles in the Finance cluster are auditor, financial analyst, treasurer, economist, bank worker, debt counselor or insurance professional. Many of the jobs in the Finance career cluster require a bachelor's degree or specialized certifications.
	Government and Public Administration	The Government and Public Administration cluster includes people who help enforce the law. They're tax collectors, municipal clerks, military workers and customs brokers. This cluster also includes postal service clerks, mail carriers and aircrew members.

Health Science



The Health Science cluster includes doctors, nurses, pharmacists, paramedics and healthcare operators. Specialized training is required for all the roles in Health Science. Nurses must attend nursing school and earn a license while doctors have more educational requirements, like earning a medical degree.

Hospitality and Tourism



The Hospitality and Tourism cluster includes jobs you can do in restaurants, bars, tourist attractions, resorts, hotels and travel agencies.



The Human Services career cluster includes not only psychologists, social workers and child advocacy professionals but also paths like hairdresser, manicurist and cosmetologist.



The Information Technology cluster is for aspiring developers, web designers, network administrators and computer support specialists. Other careers in this cluster are computer science teachers, computer forensic professionals and information security analysts.



Workers in the Law, Public Safety Corrections and Security cluster protect citizens. They're police officers, security guards, attorneys, paralegals and FBI agents. Attorneys must earn a bachelor's degree, complete three years of law school and then pass the final bar exam. A police officer must pass the Law Enforcement Entrance Exam and graduate from the Police Academy.



The Manufacturing cluster can be great for people who enjoy working with their hands: equipment operators, millwrights, assemblers and warehouse workers. These roles usually only require on-the-job training, but there are other pathways that may require a bachelor's degree. For example, there are workers who ensure safety in the factories, while others inspect the quality of products and services.

Marketing, Sales



The marketing career cluster includes sales and advertising, and focuses on influencing consumers' buying behavior and generating sales for products and services. Just about every type of organization, from your corner grocer to regional banks, public universities to multinational corporations, participates in marketing in some way.

This career cluster includes some of the most highly educated workers, like biologists, engineers, mathematicians, statisticians, chemists and geoscientists. All the roles require a minimum of a bachelor's degree in an appropriate field and professional engineers must also earn a state license.

Transportation, Distribution and Logistics



The Transportation, Distribution and Logistics cluster drive and fix vehicles or work behind the scenes to make sure that public transportation is efficient at all times. They are drivers, pilots, rail car repairers, parking lot attendants, civil engineers and transportation planners.

Health Excellence Academy Lab School (HEALS)



The **Health Excellence Academy Lab School (HEALS)** will focus on providing high school students a strong foundation and educational preparation for pursuing careers in healthcare professions with a special emphasis on educational pathways to nursing, mental health, physician assistant studies, physical therapy, occupational therapy.

The program will be held at the Emory & Henry School of Health Sciences in Marion, VA. It will begin with students in tenth grade from Wythe, Smyth, Washington, and Bristol schools. It will consist of morning Dual Enrollment classes with a medical overlay. Students will determine a medical or behavioral direction by senior year. Transportation will be provided. Students need to apply and be accepted into one of the & slots reserved for Wythe Co. Please see your School counselor ASAP to let them know you are interested in this program.





WCPS will offer students the opportunity to explore the field of Education through the

program. Students will receive high school credit for conducting job shadowing or externships in one of our 13 schools.

Students also have the opportunity to earn Dual Enrollment credit and get a head start obtaining their college degree and required Education coursework in a new partnership we have with WCC. Please see your School counselors ASAP to let them know you are interested in this program.





The career-planning component of the Profile of a Virginia Graduate provides an opportunity for students to learn more about the employment options and career paths they first explored in elementary and middle school. While there is no specific career-related activity that a student must experience (such as an internship or job-shadowing assignment) to earn a diploma, school divisions must provide opportunities for students to learn about workplace expectations and career options in their own communities and elsewhere. By reducing the number of SOL tests students must pass to earn a diploma, the new standards increase flexibility for schools to expand work-based and service-learning programs that promote college, career and civic readiness. Please see your School Counselor for options regarding the following Work-based Learning (WBL) opportunities you may have:

- Career Education (WBL8475) This experience will provide students with on-the-job-instruction and potential career exploration opportunities based on the students' selected career cluster(s). The student will also have the opportunity to strengthen motivation and acquire soft skills, workplace readiness skills, and professional skills. Students will receive a Pass (P) or Fail (F) grade for this course.
- Career Education (WBL8475-B) Capstone This experience will provide students with an opportunity to reflect on the work-based experience and display what they understand about the key aspects of the industry/career. This process will enrich the work-based learning experience and allow the student to apply meaningful knowledge and skills obtained through the program through a research based project. Student projects will be graded using a rubric.
- Manufacturing Excellence Training (WBL8475-ME) This experience will provide students with an opportunity to observe the successful practices of a wide variance of manufacturing processes. Students will attend 8 sessions consisting of on-site training and direct instruction from Manufacturing professionals.
- Education for Employment (WBL9085) This course teaches students to make informed career and continuing education choices as they transition from school, gain technical skills, and adapt to the workplace. Students are taught ethical behaviors and career-research, job-acquisition, workplace-communication, self- awareness, self-advocacy, customer-service, and life skills.



Advanced Studies Diploma

For students who see themselves attending a four year college such as JMU or VA Tech this diploma would be very helpful.



Standard Diploma

Although both the Advanced Studies and Standard Diploma are designed to prepare students to be college and career ready, this diploma allows students the opportunity to attend 2-year colleges including community colleges and some 4-year colleges. Also, for students that would like to master a trade or enroll in an apprenticeship such as welding or cosmetology this is the diploma that is often requested as a minimum requirement.

If you are earning a Standard Diploma you must also complete two sequential electives and earn a career and technical education credential.

Applied Studies Diploma

The Applied Studies Diploma is for students who have completed the requirements of their IEP and who do not meet the requirements for other diplomas. Students who earn this diploma will be eligible for ongoing services, FAPE, through the age of 21.

Additional Requirements

Additional requirements for students earning an Advanced Studies or a Standard Diploma are that they must complete one virtual course and be trained in Emergency First aid, CPR and the use of an AED. Students will also have to meet College, Career, or Civic requirement prior to graduating. For questions regarding any of these requirements, consult your school counselor.

Profile of a Virginia Graduate
